

The Bridge: Ex-Cans Programme



CITAM Response On The Supreme Court Ruling

On Right Of Association For Homosexuals

n Friday 24th of February, the Supreme Court of Kenya ruled in favour of the gay movement's right of association in Kenya. They stated that "Despite gayism being illegal (in Kenya), they have a right of association".

This rather contradictory ruling has left many of us wondering whether other illegal practitioners like paedophiles and those involved in incest also have right of association and if not, how different they are from homosexuals. And perhaps criminal organisations as well.

We note that this comes to us soon after sections of the Church in the West decided to bless gay unions. We truly commend the judges who ruled for God's creative order and for cultural preservation and dissented from that majority ruling. Similarly we

also appreciate and stand with the sections of the Christian faith communities who have stood their ground on matters biblical in spite of the schism from their umbrella organisations.

We recognize that there may be many people who are struggling with different kinds of sexual desires but they have not gone to court for the whole nation to recognize them. For one to privately struggle with such issues is one thing, but it is unwise to try to get the whole country through its various structures to endorse one's deviant behaviour. Those who struggle with homosexual desires are not significantly different from persons who are heterosexual but also struggle with sexuality in singlehood non-marriage through through widowhood or through marital separation of one form

or another. On top of this it is opposed to our cultural norms in Africa.

The Bible categorizes immoral thoughts in the heart and immoral actions as sinful, including homosexual behaviour. Bible speaks 7 times about this kind of relationship directly: Gen.19:1-11; Lev.18:22; 20:13: Judge:19:22-25; Roman:1:25-26; 1 Cor.6:9; 1Tim. 1:9-10. In all these passages, homosexuality is not approved but rather, is viewed as sinful, unnatural and perverted. the Leviticus passage, it is punishable by death. This kind lifestyle is incompatible with the new life Christians are supposed to be living in Christ.

The Bible considers homosexual behaviour as sin because:

- It is disobedient to scriptural teachings.
- It is contrary to God's created order for the family and human relationships. Human life would become extinct if everyone practiced it.
- It comes under divine judgment.
- It is sin but reconciliation and restoration to God is possible.

While Scripture makes it clear that homosexual behaviour is sin and comes under the judgment of God, it also indicates that those who are guilty of homosexual behaviour or any other sin can be reconciled to God (2 Corinthians 5:17–21). It is also one of the sins that Christ died for and can be forgiven.

Because of the above as Christians, we do hate the sin,

but love the sinners with the love of Christ. Anyone struggling in these areas are welcome to any of our CITAM assemblies for counselling and prayer, as we believe God is able to forgive, restore and help one live a straight life that is God honouring.

On the other hand, we encourage Kenyans of moral integrity to reject, resist and oppose this supreme court ruling as it will erode our societal norms and morals. We call upon Christians and Kenyans of good will to stand out in opposition to this ruling and express their disagreement openly.

Meanwhile we will continue to pray and use other acceptable means to preserve our national ethos and moral fibre against negative external influences.

The sick and needy were prayed for.















We must Change as the Cheese Moves

n December 2022 we launched a new strategic plan which will guide the ministry in the next five years. Additionally, we have just launched a new ERP system dubbed CITAM Connect. It is clear we are going through a major change, and we need to embrace it.

The reality that we are undergoing a change; a shift in the way we have been executing our mandate, has provoked me to reflect deeply.

What has come to my mind is Dr. Spencer Johnson's book, "Who Moved My Cheese?" which offers a narrative of four imaginary characters; two mice: Sniff and Scurry and two men: Hem and Haw. Every morning, the four characters ran through the Maze looking for cheese to nourish them and make them happy. They soon established their own routine of racing to enjoy the tasty new morsels that awaited them. However, this was not long lived and the Maze ran out of cheese. The Sniff and Scurry quickly realized that the cheese was no more and moved on but Hem and Haw remained in the hope that the cheese would be available as usual.



Haw realized that they needed to move on but Hem could not heed to any counsel that they needed to go and search cheese elsewhere. After much decided persuasion, Haw to leave Hem behind. 
It is pitiful the state Hem remained. This is a great mercy, because in times such as our own-times of change when many familiar landmarks have shifted or disappeared people are bewildered; they hanker after familiarity and "comfort zones". Embracing change is difficult. It has been said that the only person who enjoys change is a wet baby. We naturally dread changes and we would prefer to keep the status quo.

We have an impatience with anything and anyone that suggests there might just be another perspective, another way of doing things, another way of looking at the same thing, another answer worth exploring regarding a changed life. There is a nostalgia for the security in the womb of a safe sameness, and so we shut out the different ideas. We. therefore, resist change by looking for security in those who can provide answers that must be unassailable because we do not provide room for anyone to dissent and to question.

Doesn't God also expect us to exercise our faith in Him, our knowledge that God is in charge, and therefore be ready to take risks, to be venturesome and innovative? Christ displayed a good example when he challenged the conservative Pharisees because they clung to what they were used to; men's traditions. This caused them not to realize that the Messiah was amongst them but instead resisted Him.

For us to embrace the reality that we are in a changing world, we may need to wake up from our allergic slumber of maintaining the status quo. We must wake up, smell the coffee and move on. We may need to act like Sniff who sniffed out change early enough and Scurry who upon realizing the changing reality scurried into action. In the event we realize we have lagged behind; we may need to act like Haw who learns to adapt to new life after realizing changing can lead to something better. It would be sad for us if like Hem, we deny and resist change owing to fear of the unknown. We may soon become irrelevant or our impact pale into insignificance.


All our 7 schools due for JSS were approved by Ministry of Education and added on the KNEC portal for selection.

he School of Ministry and Leadership Development (SMLD) began in the assemblies with the goal of alleviating the shortage effective leaders at the assembly level. There was a need for welltrained and qualified leaders for the ministry with leadership skills for maximum impact at the family, church, and marketplace. SMLD emphasizes excellence lifelong in learning and development and positive community engagement with skills in leadership, ministry, Bible knowledge, and basics of Christian doctrine to positively impact families, communities, countries, the world. Its curriculum under the leadership of Dr. Baraza has undergone a process of review, and needs and impact assessment to develop standardized, harmonized, and contextualized curriculum to be offered to all CITAM Assemblies.

Though not fashioned for academic outfit parse, the program is raising a generation of God-fearing leaders with excellence in knowledge and spiritual maturity anchored in

Pillar 2; Discipleship, Pillar 4; Social Transformation, and Pillar 5; Organizational Development of CITAM's 2022-2027 Strategic Plan. The SMLD first draft is in its final stages and will be launched soon. Since its inception in CITAM in 2014, many leaders have been trained and graduated and are currently involved in ministry at the various CITAM assemblies. The latest graduation was at CITAM Buru Buru on 19th February 2023 where Rev. Dr. Phidel Baraza awarded certificates to the graduands.


On January 29, 2023, CITAM Clay City launched Cohort 2 of School of Ministry and Leadership Development (SMLD). A total of 144 church members have registered for this cohort and we believe it will be a great boost in enhancing the capacity of our ministry workers to serve in church and be impactful in society at large.

During the first cohort, 145 leaders and ministry workers registered for the program, with 122 successfully completing it and graduating. The feedback provided by this team has informed a few changes to improve the learning experience and enhance the program's impact on participants. The 144 participants have been grouped into 17 small teams, which is aimed at ensuring that the study becomes more impactful.

The assembly leadership is planning to have at least 400 members having gone through the training by 2026. Their target is to ensure that at an average of 100 members successfully complete the course every year. The occasion was graced by the Rev. Kwame Rubadiri, Head of C.E.D., as the keynote speaker. Present also was CITAM Clay City Senior Pastor, Rev. Elly Ochieng, and his deputy Rev. Stanley Amukoa.



Family Discipleship Conference (FDC) 2023 is Loading



he2023FamilyDiscipleship Conference will be held at CITAM Valley Road from 3rd to 6th May 2023. Target audience will be Millennials and Gen Z in particular but there will be material for those over 50 years and for senior singles (including widowers, widows). The Conference will have an altar ministry following every evening's plenary.

The planning committee has started the plans led by Rev. Kwame Rubadiri, co-chaired by Rev. Stanley Mung'athia.

Our theme for this year's FDC is "THE CHOICE," with Deuteronomy 30:19 as the biblical verse. "This day I call the heavens and the earth as

witnesses against you that I have set before you life and death, blessings and curses. Now choose life, so that you and your children may live."

The theme is prompted by a prevailing set of occurrences in the family, in marriages, in our high schools and even in church. Most of this center around the growing influence of the LGBTQ agenda in Africa and Kenya in particular, as recently witnessed by the Supreme Court ruling on the right of association.

We are witnessing an aggressive push to recruit (or force) young people to the LGBTQ agenda in high schools across the country as youth are pressured to agree to align with the agenda in order to secure school fees and favor from their teachers. Giving the impression that a simple choice can be made to embrace the deviant practices of the

We are witnessing a disturbing practice in young marriages (a few months to a year) where a spouse announces after a period in the marriage that they are gay and want to exit the marriage – having made a choice to pursue that lifestyle.

We are witnessing a number of couples (and singles) choosing not to be legally married and some making the choice not to have children. This is exacerbated by the increase in sexual activity from pre-teens.

We are witnessing an assault on the traditional nuclear family as a result of divorce – more "blended families" arising and a rise in depression and mental illness especially amongst children and youth.

These are just some of the issues in need of our attention and address; we will approach the most pressing at Plenary level during the Conference and convene a series of workshops where the matters can be looked at through expert eyes and deeper questions can be answered during the sessions. It is therefore our commitment at FDC 2023 to directly confront these seeming choices with the and accountability authority of the Word of God and invite our conference participants at all ages and social statuses to choose life.

Our speakers include our Presiding Bishop Calisto Odede, Pastors Kingsley and Mildred Okonkwo (David Christian Centre in Lagos, Nigeria), our Deputy Bishop Karita Mbagara, Dr Stanley Mukolwe, Moffat Mshauri, Dr Wahome Ngare, Boniface Wanyoike to name a few.
