SAFARI SERVICE CENTRE

Safari Service Center (SSC) is responsible for Membership Intake, Baptism, CBR, Impact zone and ensuring members are involved in Ministry.

CONSISTENT BIBLE READING (CBR)

In January 2023, the unit began the Consistent Bible Reading (CBR), which is an 8-months program that ran until August. The sessions are held every second Sunday of the month through a hybrid attendance of online and physical meetings at the assembly with an aim of inculcating the discipline of reading the Word of God consistently, systematically and meditatively to receive his divine instructions. During the meetings a trainer facilitates the lesson of the month and participants are given exercises to work on for that month.

MEMBERSHIP INTAKE

NEW LEADERSHIP

MISSIONS AND OUTREACH





MASHINANI MISSIONS

Between 25th and 28th April 2023, 19 missioners traveled to Kagumo village in Othaya sub-county, Nyeri County where they reached out to about 379 people through door to door evangelism and many more during Crusades and 'The Jesus Film'. To the Glory of God, 176 people gave their lives to Jesus.

URBAN MISSIONS

By God's grace the Urban missions sub-unit was given the opportunity to be ministering at Nairobi West Men's Prison for one Sunday of every month. This was through the linkage of Milcha Kanini who has consistently labored in the gospel ministry in different prisons.

They have had several Sunday services so far where they fellowshipped together with the inmates and ministered the gospel of Jesus to them. 19 inmates and 21 inmates got born again on the respective Sunday of May and June.

LEARNING INSTITUTIONS MISSIONS

On 9th April 2023, 45 missioners went to Upper Hill School where they ministered to over 1000 students with the word of God and through a drama play called "The Trial". By God's grace 15 students received Jesus.

On 16th April 2023, four missioners visited Gladphil School in Kitengela where they encouraged the students to keep good company of God fearing people from the books of 1 Corinthians 15:13.

On 14th May 2023, four missioners had an opportunity to visit and share God's word with students of Embakasi Girls where the move of the Lord was evident and 7 of the students received The Lord Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

On the 21st May 2023, four missioners had an opportunity to visit with the students of Gladphil School in Kitengela and reached out to about 21 of them. They shared God's word from Judges 2:10 and 7 of them gave their lives to the Lord


