




for Administration), Rev. Elias Githuka (Head of Missions), Rev. Anthony Makena (Head SAA) and some senior pastors from other assemblies.



201 people got saved when 25 missioners from CITAM Karen went for a mission in Saos, Eldama Ravine from 21st to 27th August 2023. They held a 3 days' DVBS where 120 children were reached. 25 youth got saved during the 3-day football tournament. 53 people got saved when the film, "The Passion of Christ Film" was shown in various places.

During the mission, missioners reached out to thirty (30) elderly people. A good number came to the church on Friday afternoon, where they had a time of singing Kalenjin hymns, preaching the Word, and prayer. Three (3) gave their lives to Jesus Christ, while two(2) rededicated their lives to Christ. They all promised to start attending church again. During the meeting, they each received a blanket and a packet of sugar and tea leaves. One Mzee man

was moved to tears and was very grateful for the gifts as he confessed that it had been a long time since he received a gift from anyone. There were also some elderly persons who were bedridden and a team visited and ministered to them in their homes.

New Church plants

CITAM has continued to witness exponential growth numerically and in line with the 2023-2027 Strategic Plan, Mission, and Vision there is a need to plant more assemblies in the main Kenyan towns.

In the year 2022, the Church leadership began the process of planting of the following six new Assemblies:

- 1. CITAM Machakos
- 2. CITAM Syokimau
- 3. CITAM Ruiru
- 4. **CITAM Embu**
- 5. CITAM Kakamega
- 6. CITAM Kericho

CITAM Machakos

The assembly has achieved considerable strides towards its establishment. assembly has leased a five-acre piece of land which was previously a school. Within the property was a four storied building which had been neglected since 2020 and therefore required some renovations to spruce it up for use. The facility has offices, classes for Sunday school, a small hall, kitchen and ablution block. Indeed, it was a plug and play facility. Since December 2022, the assembly has been meeting in the small hall for Sunday services. The numbers have grown and now they hold two services.

CITAM has leased 2 acres of land in Syokimau environs along Parliament Road for setting up of the Church and its auxiliary facilities. The church offices will be accommodated in the existing three-bedroomed Bungalow house in the property. We are following due process with the relevant licensing and regulatory authorities.

CITAM Kakamega

The Ministry leased a 2-acre plot in Kakamega Town with a property which provides Church offices, Church hall, kitchen, ablution block and parking. We ask our members to pray for the resources that are required to set up additional facilities for Sunday School, Youth etc for further expansion and growth of the Assembly.

CITAM Ruiru

The Ministry has been using Bible Translation Literacy (BTL) hall and rooms for Sunday services and the mid-week services. Already the meeting hall is now full and therefore there is need to look for a bigger facility. Plans are at advanced stages to move the assembly to a leased facility near Spur Mall, along Thika Road.

CITAM Embu

CITAM Embu is hosted by Embu College where the church has the use of the College Basket Ball pitch for pitching tents for the Sunday services. The church also uses a small hall within the college for the mid-week service and classrooms for Sunday school. The ministry has leased a three-bedroom maisonette for office space. There is need for bigger space for the church is outgrowing the tents and parking space.

CITAM Kericho

CITAM Kericho assembly is currently being hosted at the NSPSI college where they hold Sunday worship services and Sunday school classes in the rented premises. The assembly staff use a small office in the college. We look forward and trust God for the assembly to be fully settled.

CITAM Children Pastors Retreat


CITAM Children Pastors had a successful planning retreat. During the retreat they also reviewed the success of the

47,143 children thronged our assemblies for Daily Vacation School (DVBS) from Bible Monday 14th to Friday 18th August 2023. This was 60% increase from 29,418 in 2022. 16,775 children gave their lives to Christ in 2023 compared to 7,094 in 2022. This is a remarkable increase of 136%.

The crowds of children filled our assemblies, some being dropped and picked by parents while for others there was organised transport by having buses to ferry them. Thirty (30) assemblies out of the 32 Assemblies held DVBS in the year 2022.

The children were filled with the joy of the Lord as they sang songs and danced for the Lord

as well as having Bible lessons and doing craft. The Sunday services of 20th August was dedicated to the children where they sang songs, and one of them preached. DVBS is a children's discipleship aimed at reaching as many children as possible for Christ.

Four (4) out of the six (6) new assemblies were able to hold DVBS. These were Embu, Kakamega, Kericho and Machakos

We thank God for the 7809 volunteer workers. This highest number of workers recorded from previous DVBSs.



DVBS was also run on Hope Tv and there was a cumulative average of 759,400 viewership for the 5 days.

"Well done CITAM! This was a transformational week thanks to your great burden of investing in the next generation," one of the parents posted on our social media platforms.









Bishop Bonifes Adoyo's Missionary Journey to Northern Kenya



When Bishop Bonifes Adoyo was the Presiding Bishop of CITAM, he spearheaded a lot of ventures for the establishment of the mission stations in Northern Kenya. However, much has happened since the last time he visited Northern Kenya, more than 10 years ago. He had been hearing stories of what the Lord had done until he decided to set his foot on all the mission stations and witness for himself.

During the journey that took place from 19th to 24th June 2023 he was accompanied by Rev. Elias Githuka (CITAM Head of Missions), Rev. Josphat Shichende (Missions Head office Pastor) Pr. Nigel De Mello (Missions Head office Pastor) and T.L. Osborne Mariga Hope Media Journalist/Reporter/ Cameraman).

The team visited CITAM Archers' Post Mission Station and was hosted by Pastor Victor Kidemi, his wife Gertrude and Beatrice Kirunja, their fellow missionary pastor in the station.

headed to CITAM Kargi's two outposts: Dakhane and Ririma.

After Olturot Mission station, the team proceeded to CITAM Loiyangalani Mission station where they were warmly received by Pastor Peter Kahiga, and his wife Pastor Riri. They joined the medical team at the El Molo village. They met Philip, an elder living in the community (though not from the El Molo tribe) who CITAM supported to remove the cataract in one of his eyes. Bishop Adoyo prayed for him and he was greatly encouraged. The missionary on the ground



At CITAM Gororukesa Mission Station, Pastor Benedict Shoba was glad to receive the team. The team thanked God as they walked on the 16-acre plot of land, opposite the church, which was bought by CITAM. The land was acquired to develop various revenue generation projects so that the mission station would be able to become self-sufficient financially, self-governing soon and self-propagating in the future.

After visiting CITAM Maatarba Mission Station, the team

Pastor Peter Kahiga took the team to a private beach on the lake where they were able to dip their weary feet and even fully







immerse and cool off in after the long day's travel and work.

What followed was a long and grueling journey to Maralal via South Horr, Baragoi

Three times their vehicle broke down with an overheating radiator. They had fellowship and ministry at the Maralal Pentecostal Church in which Pastor. Lucas Lepario, the lead pastor. They left for Nairobi and Bisho Adoyo, though tired, he was filled with joy for what the Lord had done in the missions' stations.

Gaining Power Over Wealth Creation and Social Transformation at Mataarba and Loiyangalani

possibility there а marginalized and impoverished communities to gain power towards wealth creation and social transformation? Northern Kenya, which is mainly occupied nomadic pastoralists. has always been branded as 'nothing good can come out of it'. We mostly hear of ethnic conflicts, cattle rustling, drought and hunger which often lead to human and animal losses to death. The region is known to go for years without adequate rainfall. occasionally. We have heard stories in our media about the local people spending dayson-end looking for water. Most of the community members in these areas have resigned to their fate and surrendered dependence syndrome, especially help from without the region. They heavily depend on relief food and all manner of support mainly offered by nongovernmental organizations besides what the government offers from time to time during such seasons.

CITAM missionaries serving in Marsabit County have witnessed this challenge first hand. Most likely the biggest question that has lingered in their minds is, can this be changed, can these people be food-secure as well as create wealth? The good news is that with God all things are possible.

Something good is already happening. It is faith like a mustard seed which once planted grows into a giant tree. Therefore, small beginnings cannot be despised because out of a step of faith taken, God will honour it and do great things for





his beloved people in Northern Kenya.

After learning the success of doing agribusiness in arid and semi-arid areas at Bishop Titus Masika's demonstration farm in Yatta, the missionaries came back inspired and challenged. They are now engaged on what they would wish to see in our outreach areas in the northern frontier.


It is impressive to see how our

missionaries have embarked on this journey of socio-economic transformation through farming.

At CITAM Mataarba they first began by dealing with mind-set change of the local community. Then they went ahead to leverage on the available resources. Mataarba Mission station has a huge piece of land with 3 old water pans. With these resources, the missionary commenced on a pilot farm on a small portion of land. To have a fall-back plan in case of rain







The pilot crops were Irish potatoes, cow peace, spinach and capsicums that were all done on a small scale. To God's glory all the crops were successful without the input of artificial fertilizers.







After the community members witnessed the success of the pilot farm, they got convinced to try their own small food crop farming. A team of church members are learning as they try the use of Zai-pit-farming. Zai-pit-farming is suitable in the area because it is economical on the amount of water required for irrigation.

The journey of socio-economic transformation at Mataarba is



a journey of mindset change. As we trust God for spiritual transformation, we also desire



socio-economic transformation of the community.

Loiyangalani



The month of July has seen Loiyangalani team make significant toward steps mindset change. The women of the church have taken their farming to another level by introducing the idea of supplementing their diet with natural vitamins through cultivation of vegetables.

After the missionary engaged them on self-sustainability through farming, they took the initiative of sourcing for soil to supplement the available sandy soil. They brought it to the church compound and prepared seed beds. They have planted capsicum and cow peas. They are looking forward to do other type of crops as well.





Olturot Medical and Vet Camps

A team of 44 persons from all our CITAM assemblies and our partners participated in a successful medical and veterinary outreach in Olturot. They joined hands with the local youth who made it easy for the med-vet team by helping in translation. In partnership with the local AIC church the team managed to penetrate some the most remote villages with the gospel. By the grace of God, they reached out to 7 villages some of which are as far as 28kms away from the Olturot mission station. 1798 people were reached and 175 of them received Christ as Lord and savior. 128 rededicated their




loives to the Lord. The Jesus film reached out to 1500 people where 809 of them received Jesus as Lord and Savior. The total number of people treated

were 2957. The total number of animals that were treated was 17,518.

On the evening of Saturday the 13th of May 2023, the CITAM Missions Head Office partnered with a team from the International Mission Board (IMB) to do a "Yeshu Satsang" (Jesus Truth Telling) at one of the Asian homes in Parklands area. This tactfully, contextual, relevant gospel presentation uses symbols that appeal to the Asians worldview to simply explain the gospel of Jesus using a beautiful way using Asian style (Christian) hymns and the word of God.

The symbols explained:

- Flowers Represent life, beauty and creation
- · Lamp stand represents God and light

- Incense Sticks represents our prayers
- Coconut represents Sacrifice and Jesus

The presentation is known globally a "The Creation to Christ" gospel sharing tool. We had had the host family invite their friends and relatives to the event and had a house of fifteen people with a few beina non-believers. After the presentation, we had an opportunity to answer questions, pray for needs and fellowship over a wonderful Potluck (communal meal).

I truly believe this was what the early Church in the Book of Acts looked like, meeting house to house, sharing a meal and being given devoted to the apostle's teachings, prayer,

fellowship and the breaking of bread (Acts 2:42). Out of this small ministry one precious Asian soul came to faith in Jesus and we are discipling them in one of our Asian house fellowships. May the Lord add to us daily the number of those being saved.


Hope Media's Skiza Tune Launch

Perfecting Health in His **Presence at CITAM Mission Church Archer's Post**

CITAM Mission Church in Archer's Post, Samburu County, held their annual medical and veterinary camps from August 21st to 25th, 2023. 1,650 patients received free medical care and treatment for various ailments with about 76 of them giving their lives to Christ. A total of 6,032 animals were attended to by the vets and 166 herders heard the gospel of salvation.

This initiative, which began last year, is a recurring event within the Northern Frontier CITAM mission stations. Spearheaded by Rev. Elias Githuka (Head of Missions), it embodies the mission's commitment to holistic outreach. The chosen theme for the camps is 'Perfecting Health.' The CITAM Missions Head Office plays a key role in mobilization and support.

The endeavour of conducting free medical camps serves as a practical approach to addressing healthcare needs among the disadvantaged communities. notably in Northern Kenya, where a significant population comprises of pastoralists. Both medical and veterinary missional camps were organized to meet these needs effectively.

Local communities in Archer's Post expressed their gratitude after benefiting from the free medical and veterinary services provided during the missional camps. The medical services included screening for diabetes and hypertension, weight and obesity screening, breast and cervical cancer screening, deworming, nutritional services, and dental care. Simultaneously,

animals were offered deworming, tick control, and multivitamins during the veterinary camp.

The medical camp was held at CITAM Archer's Post church

premises, while the veterinary camp took place at designated points along Ewaso Nyiro River and Laresoro, approximately 10 kilometres from Archer's Post town. The community











lauded CITAM missions and the Archer's Post Church for offering essential medical and veterinary services that are often scarce in the area.

The success of health and veterinary missional camps stands as a testament to CITAM missions' dedication to promoting community health and well-being. A team of volunteer medical and veterinary

professionals drawn from CITAM Assemblies and other churches across various counties have continued to play a crucial role in making these events a success.

We also had a team from Christian Broadcasting Network (CBN) reaching out to children. They documented 800 attending for the five days. A total of 131 children gave their lives to Christ.

We are grateful to Mission Aviation **Fellowship** (MAF) who have continued to come alongside us offering flight services at subsidized rates for pharmaceutical supplies and part of med-vet teams to the mission fields.

Partnership With Operation Christmas Child At CITAM Missions Gororukesa

The Children's ministry at CITAM Mission Station, Gororukesa, has had great impact on the children and the community. We are grateful to our partners who have contributed to this growth. The impact has been realized through the following ways:

1. Partnership: The collaboration between CITAM Missions station Gororukesa and partners like Food for the Hungry, Child Evangelism Fellowship, and Operation

Child Christmas demonstrates the power of partnerships in expanding the reach and impact of our children ministry.

2. Operation Christmas Child: The focus is on sharing the love of God through tangible gifts. It has touched the lives of many children. The training provided to Sunday school teachers and the distribution of teaching manuals (The Greatest Journey) have contributed to spiritual growth and

- discipleship among children.
- 3. Discipleship and Spiritual Growth: The use of The Greatest Journey teaching manuals with twelve lessons has enabled the children to experience a spiritual journey that takes more than two months. The journey culminated with celebration of a graduation event, where the children presented their memory work and demonstrated the mastery of the lessons through drama presentations.
- 4. Increased Participation: The impact of Operation Christmas Child was not only limited to the spiritual



growth of the children but also led to an increase in the number of children attending Sunday school church. We received 225 gift boxes for 225 children and when we gave them out, the following Sunday the number of children increased to over 300. This growth indicates the effectiveness of Operation Christmas Child to children and the community.

5. Life Transformation: The program has played a role in transforming the lives of children in the community,



with over 50 children who formerly Muslims giving their lives to Christ and have since become

- active in the church as guided by Sunday school teachers.
- 6. Empowerment of Teachers: The teaching manual, The Greatest Journey, has not only impacted the children but also empowered the Sunday school teachers. It has contributed to their growth as mentors and providers of guidance in terms of faith for the children.

Reflection

During the Maandamano (demonstrations) davs Kenya, we were advised to work from home. Being at home, I dropped and picked my son at the gate in the mornings and afternoons. Upon seeing the long yellow bus rattling towards our gate, I looked forward to receiving and welcoming my son back to the house. My son gets off the bus with a blank face. Maybe he's tired or maybe it's been a tough day at school.

He runs to me with his bag tucked on his back. I reach out my arms to welcome him. No matter what the day held, he's home now. He's mine.

I asked him about his day. What did you do? Who did you play with? Our conversation moved from this and that until we settled to the "troublesome" boy. He began to share with me about the boy who bullies him while on the bus. He had unleashed his fury on all the boys and girls, not just mine.

I'm slowly getting over the fact that my 6 year old son is already dealing with a "bully boy" by focusing my energy on intentionally teaching him how NOT to be one and how to love him, besides reporting the matter to the teacher. Though I'm surprised and honestly annoyed that we are facing this issue, I am thankful the interaction is encouraging us to make love the theme in our conversations of faith.

The days that followed, we had conversations on forgiveness and love. I do not know what my son did to the "bully boy" but he recently came and apologized to my son. What! It was quite amazing and surprising. The "bully boy" has changed and has become a good friend to my son.

Since then, I have been looking for more ways to show my son what the Bible says about love. Additionally, I am also seeking ways albeit with difficulties on how to show love to people who want to "bully" me. I am working hard to smile back to the matatu drivers who bully me on the road. Previously, I have fought back by showing I can also cut in front them, almost shouting at them words that are not inspired by the Holy Spirit.

I Googled how to express love to my enemies. The search engine told me, "There are many ways to express love, of course - some ways you might consider are telling them, saying nice things to them, having an open discussion about what's happened or your feelings, giving them a hug, doing something nice for them, smiling, making a joke."

Jesus said, in Matthew 5:43-45, "You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor and hate your enemy. 'But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your Father in heaven." Amen.
